# Yorkshire Consortium for Equity in Doctoral Education (YCEDE) information sheet

The Sheffield Institute of Education (SIoE) at Sheffield Hallam University (SHU) are part of the YCEDE Partnership. YCEDE is a project funded by the Office for Students (OfS) and UK Research and Innovation (UKRI) that hopes to tackle race/ethnic inequalities in Postgraduate Research (PGR) access by evidence-based changes to institutional policies and procedures for recruitment, selection and retention of PGRs. YCEDE is taking place across five Yorkshire universities: University of Bradford; University of Leeds; University of Sheffield; Sheffield Hallam University; and University of York. Researchers from SIoE will be carrying out the evaluation of the YCEDE Programme.

## The survey

YCEDE consists of three workstreams of activity. You are involved in Workstream 1, which aims to widen opportunities to ensure equity of PGR access and participation in research. As part of the evaluation of this workstream the research team are running a survey with participants to understand about:

- your knowledge and understanding of PGR; and
- your experiences of the Programme.

This work involves you completing a short online survey before you take part in any YCEDE activity, and then another one in 3 months, so that we can analyse any changes on an individual level that may have taken place during that time. All data will be collected using Qualtrics and then stored on Sheffield Hallam University's secure, password-protected computers.

### Do I have to take part?

The activity described above is a key part of the evaluation of workstream 1 of the YCEDE Programme. Your participation is voluntary. Participants can withdraw data without giving a reason by contacting the project lead at SHU within one week of completing the survey (details below).

### How will my responses be used?

We will be using the survey findings to explore whether there has been an impact from workstream 1 on those individuals taking part. The data provided will be anonymised and may then be used in research reports such as peer review publications.

#### Will I be identifiable?

Your name will be anonymised for report writing, feedback to the workstream, and for wider academic research publications. The survey does ask for sensitive data such as your ethnicity and gender, but this will not be attributable to your name.

Any data will be anonymised for report writing and feedback to the workstream, or wider academic research publications. Your survey response will be linked to the university where you are participating in YCEDE activities so that analysis can be carried out between the different institutions. University staff involved with delivering Workstream 1 will not have access to your individual data and will only see aggregated findings after analysis has taken place. Your current or most recent institution will not have access to your data, only the research team who are based at Sheffield Hallam University.

#### Personal data

In order to carry out the survey we need to collect and use your personal data. Below is a list of what this will include and why we are collecting it:

Ethnicity and gender	You will be asked to provide your ethnicity and gender. The research is specifically				
	exploring ethnic inequalities in PGR, so this information will be used as part of the				
	analysis (e.g., we may look at how different ethnic groups respond to certain questions in				
	the survey). In the case that some ethnicity/gender groups have small representation we				
	will aggregate the data for analysis and reporting purposes so that students in these				
	particular group are not identifiable.				

As the Data Controller, Sheffield Hallam University will process your data in accordance with the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR, 2018). The University undertakes research as part of its function for the community under its legal status. Data protection legislation allows the University to process personal data for research with appropriate safeguards in place under the legal basis of public tasks that are in the public interest.

If you consent to taking part in the survey and then change your mind, you have the right to request for your data to be removed from our system within one week of it taking place, this is called a Subject Access Request. The retention period for the anonymised interview data will be 10 years after the last publication arising from the evaluation. All University work of this nature is reviewed to ensure that participants are treated appropriately, and their rights respected.
